INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES

1. Candidates should ease themselves before entering the Assessment room. No candidate shall be allowed to leave the Assessment room before the end of the Assessment.
2. Candidates should be seated in the Assessment Hall/room at least 15 minutes before the start of the Assessment. **Any candidate who comes thirty (30) or more minutes after the official start of the Assessment will not be allowed to sit the Assessment paper.**

4. Programmable calculators and Mobile Phones are not allowed in and around Assessment rooms.
